On the Agenda . . .

The next Town Meeting at Town Hall will be on Tuesday, September 11th at 7:30 p.m. At the top of the agenda, will be a Charter Amendment, and, an Ordinance to establish a Town of Upper Marlboro Historic Committee.

Currently, Section 82-46 of the Town's Charter requires that all checks be signed by the Treasurer. The proposed amendment to the Charter would permit the Board to adopt an ordinance or resolution authorizing additional person[s] to sign checks when the Treasurer is unavailable and it is in the interests of the Town to issue a payment. The proposed amendment also requires the Board to adopt an ordinance or resolution that sets a dollar amount in ex-

cess of which requires the signature of both the Treasurer and President. Provisions are also set forth, in the event of incapacity of the authorized signers.

On August 4th, residents met at Town Hall to discuss forming a Town Historical Committee. Based on that discussion, the Board introduced an ordinance at the August Town Meeting providing for the formation of a formal committee. The mission of the Committee is to investigate, collect, discover, advance, preserve and disseminate the history of the Town. Adoption of the Ordinance will be up for a final vote at the next Town

Meeting in September. Under the Ordinance, the Board will appoint seven members and a Chairperson for two-year terms. The Committee then votes in a Vice Chairperson and Secretary. They would be required to meet at least four times a year, provide quarterly reports to the Board, and submit an annual budget request to the Board President. All meetings will be open to the public.

Committee members will be officially appointed by the Town, but, any other interested citizens (in or outside the Town) are urged to participate as non-voting members.
