Residents Awarded for Restoration of 'Kingston' Estate

inston Churchill, direct descendent of the namesake of Upper Marlborough, once said, "We shape our buildings. Thereafter, our buildings shape us." Perhaps nowhere is this more evident than at Kingston, the boyhood home of Dr. Pat Clagett, and now his residence with his wife, Nancy. For their considerable efforts to preserve their home, believed to be the oldest building in existence in the Town of Upper Marlboro, Mr. and Mrs. Clagett were honored with the "Saint George's Day Award Given by the Prince Georges County Historical Society for the Restoration of Kingston" during the PGCHS's annual dinner held on 21 April 2013.

Located high on a hill on land originally owned by Colonel Ninian Beall and known as "The Meadows," Kingston is a one and a half story, five bay wide Tidewater style house with porches stretching the length of the house front and back. In 1728, part of Colonel Beall's tract was sold to David Crauford who built the home in 1730. He passed the home and associated tract of land to his son, David Crauford II, who renamed the property "Kingston Park" in 1774. In 1859, the property was sold by the Crauford family to Dr. Frederick Sasscer, thus beginning the Clagett family's long history of ownership. Dr. Sasscer can be credited with the home's conversion to a Gothic style cottage, when decorative scrollwork was added to the eaves.

Upon Dr. Sasscer's passing, the home was passed down through generations of Claggets, finally making it

Clagett in 2010. During the extensive historic preservation effort, many novel aspects of the home were rediscovered, to include the original molding in the dining room. As Susan Pearl commented, there were "Mysteries to be solved during [the home's] preservation," to include the discovery of a pull out tray in the dining room wall "hidden under years and years and layers and layers of paint." According to Ms. Pearl, the paint had "...covered up the tray so it looked like a molding."

The effort to restore Kingston required diligence and a willingness to see beyond years of neglect. Pat and Nancy were not only enthusiastic, but

were even willing to roll up their sleeves to conduct some of the preservation work themselves. As historic preservation consultant Daniel Filippelli stated, "I cannot say enough about the earnestness and dedication of Dr. Patrick and Nancy Clagett to see this project through to completion"

Congratulations for a job well done—the Craufords and Dr. Sasscer would be proud.

On the Agenda . . . for the Next Town Meeting

he May Regular Town Meeting will be held on Tuesday the 14th at 7:30 pm at Town Hall. There a several important matters on the proposed agenda. The proposed budget for fiscal year 2014 (FY2014) will be introduced. The total estimated operational revenues and expenditures are in line with the FY2013 Budget, the capital budget includes funds to start the process for building the addition to Town Hall and paving in Marlborough Towne. The FY2014 Budget Ordinance will be up for approval at the June 4th Town Meeting. We are moving the Regular June 11th Town Meeting up a week so that the FY2014 Budget will be effective before the end of the current fiscal year.

After years of dealing with the subject, the Board will have before it a resolution to adopt the amended I-Net Bylaws. This resolution is required in order to join the Prince George's I-Net. The I-Net is owned by the County and is a direct link to other government agencies. The I-Net also has a portal to the internet. It provides increased content and speed over our current internet connection and will be more cost effective. The Town's admission to the I-Net has been approved by the requisite governing body.

The last major item on the agenda is a decision to change to a different health insurance carrier. It's no secret that health insurance costs have gone up substantially over the past few years. The passage of the federal legislation has added an element of uncertainty. For several years, the Town has been looking into joining a heath insurance cooperative set up by the Local Government Insurance Trust (LGIT), our insurance carrier. The cooperative membership is restricted to Maryland municipalities. I believe, that over time, joining the cooperative will be in the best interest of the Town.
