Automated Speed Enforcement Ordinance 2018-02: President Turner introduced representatives of Gatso USA to discuss options for speed and red-light enforcement within the Town. The representatives answered questions from the Board and Chief Washington regarding implementing an automated traffic enforcement system within Town. President Turner requested that they come back to the Town with recommendations after an assessment.

FY18 Budget Amendment Ordinance 2018-01: President Turner reported that the Town is receiving comments on both Ordinances up for a Board vote. The Board agreed to change the March regular worksession on Tuesday March 27, 2018 to a Special Town Meeting to vote on these Ordinances. The Board agreed that comments would be due by Friday March 16 to give the Town time to process and reply to the comments.


